Amateur Handler

To be shown in-hand by an Amateur or Jr/YR with a current USEF Amateur card. Open to fillies, mares and geldings in any age group. No stallions or colts except weanlings. To be judged on presentation of the animal to the judge, neatness and appearance of the handler, overall condition of the animal, handling techniques, appropriate tack and equipment, demonstration of correct training and ability to show horse to the best of its ability.

22. Amateur Handler - Class will be divided as JR and AA if entries warrant

Materiale Classes

Horses will be evaluated under saddle at walk/trot/canter and evaluated according to the criteria listed on the "USDF Materiale Class Scoresheet" and classes must be conducted according to USEF rules (DR133) and the USDF "Procedures to Host USDF Materiale Classes." Ages may be combined if entries warrant.

23. Fillies, 3 year old (2005)
24. Colts/Geldings, 3 year old (2005)
25. Mares, 4 & 5 year old

Under Saddle Classes

For classes 28 thru 32, entries shall be shown at the walk/trot/canter both ways of the ring. Judging to be weighted 60% movement, 30% confirmation and 10% general impression.

Individual Breed Classes (IBC)

Complete breed documentation must accompany entry. Entries without complete documentation will not be accepted into the class. Classes are to be shown in-hand and move at judge's discretion.

33. Dutch Warmblood: Open to horses of any age registered with Dutch Warmblood Studbook (KWPN) and/or Dutch Warmblood Studbook of North America (NA/WPN)

34. Oldenburg Verband: Open to horses of any age registered with the German Oldenburg Verband (Verband der Züchter des Oldenburger Pferdes).
American office - Oldenburg Horse Breeders Society of America
35. Hanoverian: Open to horses of any age registered with the Hannoveraner Verband and/or with the American Hanoverian Society
36. Danish Warmblood: Open to horses of any age registered with the Danish Warmblood Society and/or with the North American Danish Warmblood Association (NADWA)
37. Rheinland Pfalz Saar: Open to horses any age registered with the Pferdezuchtverband Rheinland-Pfalz-Saar e.V. American office - Rheinland Pfalz-Saar International (RPSI). Owner must be current member as well. Obtain documentation from RPSI
38. Trakehner: Open to horses of any age registered with the Trakehner Verband and/or the American Trakehner Association (ATA)
39. Swedish Warmblood: Open to horses of any age registered with the Avelsföreningen för Svenska Varmblodiga Hästen (ASVH) and/or Swedish Warmblood Association of North America (SWANA)
40. Oldenburg ISR: Open to horses of any age registered with the ISR-Oldenburg Registry North America
41. Andalusian/Lusitano: Open to horses of any age registered with the International Andalusian and Lusitano Horse Association (IALHA)

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

1. AWARDS

Six Ribbons and First Place Trophy for each class except in championship classes which will be awarded Champion and Reserve ribbons and Champion Trophy. IBC classes will receive ribbons and high-point award depending on the number of horses in each class.

2. ENTRIES

In-Hand and Under Saddle classes are \$35. Group classes are \$20 per horse. No fee for Championship classes. **All entries MUST include USEF and USDF proofs of membership for handler/rider, owner, trainer and horse, a \$12 USEF drug fee (\$7 Drug & Med fee, \$5 USEF fee), and a non-refundable \$15 office fee. No entry accepted without a negative Coggins dated within 12 months of show and record of shots. Complete entries with signatures in all three places (rider, owner, trainer) - writing "same" is not acceptable. Please include \$20 USEF non-member fee and /or \$5 discipline fee if applicable.** Checks payable to Pineland Farms, Inc. Refunds, less \$15 office fee, made before closing date. Changes, including scratching and adding classes, made after closing date will be charged a \$10 fee. Incomplete entries (e.g. missing card copies, signatures, Coggins, breed papers, etc.) will be held and charged a \$15 incomplete entry fee. The owner will be notified of the missing information and entries will not be processed until all necessary information is received. Non-

negotiable check will be charged \$25. Post entries will be accepted with a \$20 post entry fee. All changes/cancellations must be in writing. Management reserves the right to combine, divide or cancel classes. **Unconditionally, no refunds after closing date, including cancellations of classes due to severe weather or other emergency.**

USEF Rule GR 1401.9

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of the rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

ATTENTION COMPETITORS:

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, United States Equestrian Federation) for horse, owner, rider and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

3. TIMES

Tentative schedule will be posted on the website, www.pinelandfarms.org, one week prior to the competition.

4. STABLING

Limited number of permanent stalls with doors available. Only complete entries will be considered for stabling. Please call Show Secretary for details.

6. DIRECTIONS

From I-95: Take the Maine Turnpike to Exit 63 (formerly Exit 11) in Gray, Maine. Turn to the right after the toll booth, toward the center of Gray Village. Stay in the far right lane. At the

first intersection, go straight through the light onto Route 115. Continue on Route 115 (East) for 1.6 miles, then turn left onto Depot Road. Continue on Depot Road for 2.8 miles to a stop sign. Turn right at the stop sign onto Route 231/Intervale Road. PFEC is on your right at the crest of the hill.

7. FOOTING

One 260' x 100' Indoor Perma-Flex arena and one 250' x 100' outdoor Perma-Flex arena.

8. ENTERTAINMENT

Food will be available on the grounds beginning at 7AM.

9. OTHER

Farrrier on call. Veterinarian on call is Annabessacook Equine Clinic, (207) 933-6424. All emergency numbers will be posted at the Secretary's office. **No dogs are allowed at Pineland Farms.** No smoking allowed on show grounds. Helmets are required for all mounted activities.

Rule GR1301.7 Motorized Vehicles

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
